

Are Tattoos & Piercings Permissible For Christians?

Tattoos And Piercings And The Christian

Many people will say that their tattoo opens doors with a certain crowd of people, gives them cultural authenticity, or that it is helpful as a witnessing tool. To that I would say that Christ's apostles and disciples "preached Jesus" through their actions and words. They didn't need gimmicks or cool fashions or fads of the day to relate to people and neither do we!

You don't need physical piercings to relate to people. The Bible says in **Hebrews 4:12**, "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

The disciples preached God's word, lived by God's commands. People saw Jesus living through them and learned what it meant to be saved by hearing them preaching God's word and seeing the fruit of their lives. The disciples didn't try to be fashionable like the world. They didn't seek to entertain the world.

Matthew 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven. (Your light, not your tat)

Our Christian light should shine. We should not be busy taking on the world's image. We should not be concerned with looking such a way that is pleasing to men. **Galatians 1:10**, "For do I now persuade men, or God? **or do I seek to please men?** for if I yet pleased men, I should not be the servant of Christ." **Acts 5:29**, "We ought to obey God rather than men."

For those who say, "But I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some" (1 Corinthians 9:22), I say to you that God's word has already shown us that we are NOT to be conformed to this wicked and adulteress world.
