

ARE YOU FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT?

Are you really filled with the Holy Spirit? Now I don't mean do you make some unintelligible sounds that some people call a prayer language, trying to justify this activity by misinterpreting scriptures, ignoring Paul's statements like: *"There are, it may be, so many kinds of voices in the world, and none of them is without signification. Therefore if I know not the meaning of the voice, I shall be unto him that speaketh a barbarian, and he that speaketh shall be a barbarian unto me"* [1 Cor 14:10-11] Nor do I mean do you perform miracles, because this is what Jesus had to say about those things: *"A wicked and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given unto it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas."* [Matt 16:4] What I mean is, **does the Spirit that is in you produce the fruit of a true believer in Christ?...** *"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."* [Gal 5:22-23]

Do you care about being obedient to God's word more than about experiences and miracles? Really? Do you keep this commandment: *"And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you"* [2 Cor 6:16-17]? **Many Charismatics prefer unity over doctrine** provided the people they are in unity with have had the same experiences (tongues and other signs and wonders). Many Charismatics think that Catholics are saved by virtue of them having a tongues speaking experience, meanwhile they are still worshipping idols, like the eucharist (wafer god) and Mary (Rome's Queen of heaven).

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Charismatic tongue speakers should examine themselves and see if they need to address some questions about their behavior, namely, would God want us to:

1. distract others when they pray? (1 Corinthians 14:32-33 & 40)
2. pray meaningless prayers? (1 Corinthians 14:9-15)
3. be preoccupied with the spiritual gift Paul considered the least of the gifts?
4. think we are more spiritual because of some gift we have? (Proverbs 16:18-19)
5. think that God is holding back a gift from those who don't speak in tongues? (1 Corinthians 12:4-11 & 30)
6. think that we are not complete in Christ unless we speak in tongues? (Colossians 2:10)
7. be unsatisfied with what God has already given us? (Phil 4:11)
8. think we are blaspheming God if we question the authenticity of a tongues speaker when what we are doing is testing the spirits? (1 John 4:1)
9. delay winning souls until we've had a religious experience (ie. power from on high)? The woman in John 4:29 did not delay.
10. cause division by making others feel we are not all equal in Christ? (Romans 16:17-18)
11. misinterpret scripture like Joel 2:28 which was already fulfilled at Pentecost (see Acts 2:17)?
12. be attracted to churches full of signs and wonders rather than those preaching sound doctrine? (2 Timothy 4:3-4)
13. live by our emotions and experiences rather than by the Word of God? (Matthew 4:4)
14. unite with idol worshippers (Charismatic Catholics) who refuse to leave an idol worshipping institution? (2 Cor 6:16-17)
15. add to God's word by our own utterances and interpretations 'from God'? (Revelation 22:18)

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
